What's New at the Adamstown Pool?

Major renovations have begun at the Adamstown Community Pool including upgrading the restrooms, adding a new family restroom, a new entryway and office and the addition of handicap and stroller accessible pathways! Plans to upgrade the baby pool are underway for 2016.

Spring Property Cleanup

The Borough's code requires that 'premises & exterior property shall be maintained free from weeds or plant growth in excess of ten inches. This does not include cultivated flowers, gardens, trees and shrubs. To help dispose of leaf refuse left over from last fall, the Borough is offering two spring leaf collection dates. May 1st and May 29th Reams Disposal will be doing a leaf collection. All bags must be at curbside by 7:00AM the morning of pickup. Bags may contain only leaves. Leaf bags are available for purchase at the Borough office for 25¢ per bag.



Street Sweeping

The streets will be swept clean of winter debris on May 5th and May 6th. Be sure your car is removed from the street during this time to avoid ticketing.

Community Days

Our annual community celebration will be held May 23, 24 & 25. As always, there will be food, games and free entertainment, plus Sunday night fireworks that brings people from miles away.

The Adamstown FireQuacker 1000 will be held at the Willow Street bridge on May 9 (raindate is May 16). Cost of each duck is \$5 with a special price this year of three ducks for \$10. All proceeds help support Community Days. Tickets will be on sale at the post office Saturday mornings from 9AM until noon and at the Borough office during regular office hours.
